


Professional Development Opportunities for Graduate Students

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OGAPS Goal

What is PD?





- Training outside traditional, disciplinebased graduate coursework.
- Helps bridge the gap between graduate education and the workforce.

What is PD?

Goals of participating in PD:

- Students learn skills that are transferable.
- Students gain greater awareness of different career paths (thus, increasing confidence and independence).



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Why is PD important?

Today's Job Market

- The tight job market in higher education is widespread.
- 2. Job mobility (multiple careers) is the new normal.

3. More people graduating with advanced degrees.


Measures for Success

PD & Well-being



- Survey by UC-Berkeley showed that:
 - "Graduate students' beliefs about their career prospects are overall the top predictor of their well-being, strongly predicting their satisfaction with life and depression."

Career outcomes for U.S. May 2015 grads, within 6 months of graduation:

- Master's Degree grads:
 - 70.6% = employed FT in "standard job"
 - 8.6% = employed PT, entrepreneur, freelance, etc.
 - 8.0% = continuing education
 - 1.0% = Service/Military
 - 11.8% = not employed (both seeking and not seeking)

Career outcomes for U.S. May 2015 grads, within 6 months of graduation:

- Doctoral Degree grads:
 - 61.5% = employed FT in "standard job" (industry)
 - 15% = post-doctoral positions
 - 6.5% = employed PT, entrepreneur, freelance, etc.
 - 6.0% = employed FT as faculty (tenure & non-tenure)
 - 2.2% = continuing education
 - 0.5% = Service/Military
 - 8.2% = not employed (both seeking and not seeking)

• What are YOUR career goals? (Not your parents' goals, PI's goals, etc.)

• Does your primary career goal fit the realities of the job market in your discipline?

• What is your back-up plan?




